You will have until the October meeting to carve a sphere (ball) using only a knife (honor system

here) No sanding allowed. Select your best ball to enter the. The balls will be rolled down a tubular ramp onto the floor, allowing them to roll toward a target. Prizes will be awarded in two separate categories: accuracy & distance.

There won't be any actual carving at the September meeting, so you won't need to bring your knife, but bring it to the October meeting, for last minute "fine tuning" of your entry.
